Easier Than Ever Before

- The history of family history
- Heightened awareness due to celebrity links (BBC's *WDYTYA?*)
- Impact of the worldwide web
 - Family history research process revolutionized
 - Records are now infinitely more accessible
 - Research can be done at home at any time of day or night
 - Results available within seconds
- Effective combination of Internet research and traditional research methods (records and repositories)

Working With Primary Sources

- Term used to describe source material closest to the person, information, period, or idea being studied
- Historical primary sources are the foundation from which we can build our knowledge of the world around us
- Primary sources have the most objective connection to the past - they "speak for themselves" in ways that cannot be captured through the filter of secondary sources

"An area of historical study, considered by some to be a social science, that attempts to view historical evidence from the point of view of developing social trends."

Social History

- Negative preconceptions
 - Viewed by historians as “the history with the politics left out”
 - Defended as "history with the people put back in"
- The people’s history
 - Everyday people and how they shape history
 - What made the UK what it is today?
 - Local history
- Records of local housing, health, education, religion and work help provide a better understanding of ancestors
- Analysis of aspects of civil society that show the evolution of social norms including behaviors & much more

- Prior to mid C19th most records created by ecclesiastical authorities:
 - Parishes
 - Hundreds
 - Diocese
 - Prerogative Courts
- Often the only source of data pre 1837, and a vital source right up to the 1870s.

Published Sources

- Newspapers
 - Hugely abundant and valuable source of information which often contain useful genealogical information
- Directories
 - Yellow pages of the past – a Victorian obsession
- Gazetteers
 - Geographical dictionary or directory – useful to understand a place you are researching

FEAST FOR THE POOR. On Christmas-day, the poor in Truro workhouse were treated with a dinner of roast beef and plum pudding, and a pint of beer each, which had been kindly provided by the private subscription of the gentlemen composing the board of guardians.
